Regional Profiles of Postsecondary Institutions and Transfer Pathways

Conducted by Student-Ready Strategies (SRS)

As part of ongoing work to support the AB 928 Committee and its study groups, SRS created regional transfer profiles, based on the 12 regions utilized by <u>California Competes</u>. For each region, SRS compiled the following information from the footnoted sources:

- Poverty Rate¹
- Counties²
- Community Colleges³
- Public Universities⁴
- Private Colleges and Universities⁵ colleges and universities listed if they accept ADTs, with a note for those that have a formal MOU in place to accept ADT earners as juniors
- Number of Complete Transfer Pathways in the region
- Number of Incomplete Transfer Pathways in the region

To count the number of complete and incomplete transfer pathways for a region, SRS created a combined data set that included regional data on the ADT offerings by the community colleges⁶, the ADTs accepted by the CSUs⁷, and the ADTs accepted by AICCU institutions with an active MOU with the community colleges⁸. A pathway was considered complete for a given discipline if a community college in the region offered the ADT and a CSU and/or AICCU institution in the region accepts the ADT in the same discipline. Incomplete pathways included disciplines for which the community colleges offer the ADT but no 4-year institution accepts it, as well as disciplines for which one or more 4-year institutions accepts the ADT but no community college offers it.
